### The Event

This is a 3/4 mile juried race of pushed, pulled, or pedaled sculpture with a daylong exhibition at the Cambridge Arts River Festival. The festival is an annual celebration with 150,000–200,000 festival-goers. Entries are due Feb 26. Participants have the opportunity to join in a spectacular, well-attended event, and exhibit their work publicly on Race Day and on the PSR site. See the website for detailed rules and updates.

### Three Basic Guidelines

1. The overriding aesthetic is spectacle (visually striking performance or display).
2. Movement must be human-powered. Wheels must be integral to the work.
3. This is a total art event: projects may include performance, sound art, costumes, & kinetic objects.

### How to Enter

Three jurors, including celebrated kinetic sculptor **Anne Lilly**, will judge work on the basis of quality, originality, fidelity to guidelines, practicality, & entrants' demonstrated capacity to complete the project. (The other two jurors are TBA.) Email proposals, title, images of proposed and past work, short bio, contact info by February 26 to [sculptureracing@gmail.com](mailto:sculptureracing@gmail.com) Notifications within two weeks of entry date.

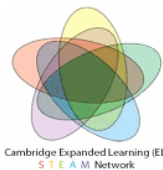
### Other Races
